From the President

Welcome fellow members, and I hope that everyone has had a great start to 2024.

As we have reported elsewhere, we have been forced to postpone our proposed Australia Day event for 2024. The weather has again been against us, with the flood event occurring last week. Some concerns remain, in particular the unpleasant odors that have been lingering since the water started to recede. We will be looking into that to understand the origins and to hopefully prevent it from re-occurring. Those that have already registered and paid for the event can either have their money refunded or simply wait for the update on the event.

The committee will be lodging a business case to the MAAA in an attempt reclaim some of the costs that the club will expend due to this latest flood. Members of the committee and co-op will also continue to lobby our case to Melbourne Water with a view to some form of mitigation for future heavy rain events.

We have also reported that our club has been successful in receiving an updated area approval for our field. CASA has issued many such approvals in the past few weeks and is working closely with the MAAA to ensure a smooth path ahead for process. It is likely that our new approval will again be re-issued soon to accommodate a few changes from CASA but will not impact on our flying area or height exemption. More details will be released once we have them.

General Working Bee Saturday January 20th (Peter Harris)

The working bee to re-instate our facilities will commence at 9am, run through until around 12 noon on Saturday. Runways are **CLOSED** while work is being carried out.

The flood waters have receded leaving a trail of mud and debris. Headed by Norm Morrish a small team of members have already been hard at work cleaning up the mess but there is still a great deal to be accomplished.

- The toilet block has been cleaned and sanitized.
- The machinery shed and equipment has been cleaned.
- The carpet tiles have been removed from the clubhouse to allow the floor to dry and expect them to be replaced on Friday.

Remaining General maintenance work in and around the clubhouse includes:

- Scrub the verandah.
- Clear out water damaged books in the library.
- Clean chairs, folding Tables and flood lines on walls or equipment.
- Clean up water-soaked soft drink boxes.
- Pressure washing under the Hay Shed.
- Cleaning mud off Old Machinery Shed floor.
- Cleaning equipment and signs caught in the flood water.
- Cleaning the spare chairs in the Shed
