ACCESS GATE

There is a new gate access to the paddock to the south of our Main Flying Strip.

The gate provides access to the paddock for retrieval of downed models without the need to climb over the style.

The gate has been modified to prevent livestock entering our Flying field, by making it open one way only & close automatically.

The gate is padlocked, to open it, use your Club Key, and be sure to relock the padlock after you use it.

THE GATE MUST REMAIN LOCKED AT ALL TIMES TO PREVENT LIVESTOCK ENTERING OUT PROPERTY.

FIELD MANAGER

Hi Everyone,

First my apologies for the lack of reports this year. It was a busy year for me, but I did concentrate on the up keep of the field. It would not be possible without the great support from Daniel Jenkins and the mowermen.

Two of our mowermen are unbelievable, lan Jaques never flies and Rolf Koehler only a few times, yet they always turn up to do the mowing.

I am looking for mowermen who are able to mow on a Thursday or Friday. We try not to mow on a weekend but sometimes we do due to weather. We only mow when the grass is dry so that we do not leave clumps on the runways. Please give me a ring on 0418 586 406.

I did a soil test on our runways and the ph is perfect. The lime and nutrient applications last year have worked. This means low areas on the runways can be top dressed with good soil in Autumn. We have purchased 5 truck loads, 50 cub M, paid by the MAAA grant. We will have them delivered as required and to suit the weather.

Daniel sprayed for the broadleaf and then in October we sprayed for the black African Beatle, whilst in larvae form. So far we have not seen any beatles but I am concerned about the amount of dry grass. Please let me know if you see any. They are approx 10mm diameter. All 6 zones of runway sprinklers are now operational and can be switched on by my mobile phone app that Daniel set up for me. A green light is also visible on the Hay shed camera to verify the pump is running. A big thanks to Daniel and Frank McP for setting this up. It saves many trips to the field. The new weather gauges are 24/7 real time so I do not run the sprinklers if windy. A great system that allows me to operate it even when interstate.

Finally a big thank you to all who turned up to the October working bee to help raise the low sprinkler heads and to spread a heap of dirt on some low spots on the East runway and the pits. Your efforts certainly help make the place look great and make me proud to be a member.

Access Gate: Brian Green has installed a gate next to the style on the east west runway. The committee have temporarily locked this gate until it can be modified.

The President acknowledged the gate was a donation from Brian, but advised Brian that he was never actually authorised to install the gate. The arrangement was that Brian was to obtain quotes and submit them to the committee. Alan read out the minutes from the October meeting to confirm this. The President reiterated that the Co-op own the fencing and any work on the property or its assets must be authorised by them. They also have the tenant and his livestock to consider when modifying any fencing.


The President then asked Rob Till (Co-op) secretary to explain why we have temporarily locked the gate. Rob explained that any general access from the flying area to the tenanted area must be self-closing to prevent the cattle and sheep form entering our flying area this isn't good for the livestock or our runways as they will do severe damage to the runway. The gate will be modified to be self-closing and restricted opening. This is so it opens only far enough to let someone through and not let the livestock through. Some components have already been purchased and the modifications will be done over the next few weeks.

Fire extinguishers: There was a comment on Facebook that there was a danger if a model crashed in the outfield and the lipo caught fire and a suggestion that we provide extinguishing equipment. Norm Morrish pointed out that we do already have extinguishers in the Gazebo (TX Pound) and at both Charging Stations. We also have "Fire Beaters" in the Gazebo. So, there is already adequate equipment around the field. The Committee spoke with the CFA about this 3+ years ago re adequate fire protection.

Peter Harris also suggested that we should call the CFA ASAP if the fire can't be controlled quickly as that is their job.



BUILDING A "THUNDERBIRD 40" MODEL

I was bought up in the country until we moved to the Melbourne suburbs when I was about 7 years old. At that time all I knew of model aircraft were the Airfix models that came in clear plastic bags that I bought from the newsagent. I spent most of my holidays at my Grandmother's house in Strathmore which was about five minutes bike ride from Essendon Airport.

Grandma would make me sandwiches and a bottle of cordial and then I would ride to the airport and sit and watch the aircraft come and go all day. I was also fortunate that one of my Uncles owned and flew a Tiger Moth but he passed away before I could thumb a lift.

I had never seen control line flying until I saw some boys flying in the park over the road from Grandma's. Needless to say I was hooked. After much nagging my parents bought me my first motor for Christmas, a Taipan 2.5 diesel and that motor powered all of my aircraft as they couldn't afford to buy me any more.

One day I rode over to Caulfield Racecourse because I heard that there were a few boys that flew there and that's when I saw it, the Thunderbird !! It was a large aircraft for it's day with a 54" span and a beautiful elliptical wing – the wing was what attracted me to it and I had to have one.

I managed to obtain a plan from someone and it was well used. It looked as though a couple of models were built over it without any protective covering (wax paper) so it was in a few torn pieces but I managed to trace the ribs onto paper then transferred the images to balsa. A few nights and a packet of Band Aids later I managed to cut all of the parts out with a blunt single edge razor blade. I had never built a tapered wing before but it came out ok and it flew well. 17 years of age and cars and girls appeared on the horizon so modeling took a back seat until my late 20's. I can't remember what happened to the Thunderbird but I have always loved the model and thought about converting one to RC, so I did.

I stayed with the plan except for the wing which had two thin balsa spars at the front 3/16th" square and even thinner ones at the back 1/8" square. I thought the wing would clap it's hands in no time so I replaced them with carbon fiber rods and did that make a huge difference !!

I built the "Inline" version but I was also surprised to find out there is a radial version as well with a slightly different fuselage and tail fin. Something else I noticed, while looking at the plan the left wing was one bay longer than the right.

A phone call to Darryll Cope and he told me that it was common in control line models, something I never noticed years ago. I think it's because the outer wing is flying faster than the inner wing so it needs less lift – correct me if I'm wrong. Anyway when I had the plan copied I had it done in reverse so now I have two wing halves with the correct length so all I did was to tape them both together and viola ! one complete wing plan to build over.

The Thunderbird is a typical design of this style of aircraft ie: short coupled, forward mounted undercart and a long nose so I didn't think I would have trouble with it being tail heavy.

Radio installation was a little tight because of the narrow fuselage but plenty of room for slim line batteries. I bought two 2200Mha and piggybacked them so they easily fitted in the battery bay. The motor is accessible from the bottom with plenty of cooling from under and the "in line" cowl on the top.

Livery is as close to original as I could source. Covering is Solartex with black lacquer trim and the graphics are computer generated Vinyl.

Showing the electric power plant


