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EDITOR'S BIT

Brian Evans Feiseler Storch

The Fieseler Fi 156 *Storch* (English: Stork) was a small German liaison aircraft built by Fieseler before and during World War II. Production continued in other countries into the 1950s for the private market. It remains famous for its excellent STOL performance and low stall speed of 31 mph (50 km/h). French-built later variants often appear at air shows.

A design feature, rare for land-based aircraft enabled the wings on the *Storch* to be folded back along the fuselage in a manner similar to the wings of the Royal Navy's Fairey Swordfish torpedo bomber. This allowed the aircraft to be carried on a trailer or even towed slowly behind a vehicle.

In flight, the main landing gear legs hung down, giving the aircraft the appearance of a long-legged, big-winged bird, hence its nickname, Storch. With its very low landing speed, the Storch often appeared to land vertically, or even backwards in strong winds from directly ahead.

SAFETY REPORT

It's been great to see an increasing number of members using the field and enjoying our great facilities as the restrictions are being relaxed. However there has been considerable disregard to safety rules over the past couple of months. The rules are there for our protection and to enable the best use of the setup of the runways.

Some of the safety breaches include: -

- Not returning to Pilot standing areas thereby obscuring the view of other pilots and leaving yourself at higher risk of injury.
- Taxiing models directly towards other members in the pilot standing areas.
- Taxiing through the Pitts
- Working on electric models while armed, prop still attached and not restrained.
- Starting models while not restrained.
- Flying with disregard to the duty strip as designated by the Mustang sign. Please check before each flight to ensure the duty strip has not been changed.
- Flying against the nominated flight direction.
- Starting jet turbines within 9 meters of other members.
- Operating Jet turbines without an assistant who is required to have control of the extinguisher.

We should be showing by example the correct operating procedures not only to our juniors but also to the many new members that have joined the club over the past six weeks. Many have not completed the membership process, and as such have not gone through the induction process which includes an explanation of our operating procedures. For these new members may I suggest you look up the Flying Rules on our Web site to avoid any embarrassment at the field.

P&DARCS Burley Field - Radio Frequency Testing

Due to some concerns raised my members, arising from a failsafe incident involving two model aircraft which had occurred at the club last year, the committee had agreed to allow for an internal investigation. It should be noted that this was an isolated case and there have not been any further repeats of this situation.

The radio testing was completed by Peter Cossins - Dip. Elec Eng. SMIREE (Ret), MIE Aust. (Ret) and Ray Cooper. Peter and Ray had recently performed radio frequency testing at the Mt Hollowback glider slope location near Ballarat, so it made perfect sense to approach them to conduct the frequency testing at our facility.

The flight testing was conducted over two sessions, with the first being on Wednesday 25th November and a subsequent test completed on Friday 4th December 2020.

Flight testing around the steel pilot safety fencing was satisfactory from all runways. The metal fencing on the Eastern runway is relatively low and the steel mesh grid is large enough to allow the propagation of 2.4 Ghz RF signals. All measurements made have led to a conclusion that it is <u>very unlikely</u> that the metal barriers will be a problem at P&DARCS.

The incident that occurred in May 2020, has been deemed an isolated case, given there have been no further events of the same type and seems unlikely to be related to the "field" as such. When these incidents occur, it is important to document them and conduct follow up range and failsafe testing of the equipment and systems. IE Tx/Rx Brand model, firmware (if known), ESC BEC or separate Rx battery, Rx antenna location, etc.

The above reported incident also serves as a timely reminder to club members the importance of correctly setting the "failsafe" on their transmitter/receiver equipment. What is set in the workshop may not be satisfactory after the aircraft has been flown and re-trimmed. Not all aircraft are the same and may require a different strategy to enable the failsafe to be set correctly. For example, an electric powered glider should have the failsafe setup to: Motor off, Spoilers/Flaps deployed (if fitted), a gentle turn (to minimize a fly away).

SECRETARY'S REPORT

January 2021 Committee Meeting Summary

The Club's committee met for the first time in 2021 on Thursday night January 21st via Zoom. Some of the items considered are noted below;

- The changes to the COVID restrictions continue to be monitored to ensure the club conforms.
- Two Prospective members, Stephen Green and Alex Subosch, were voted into the Club.
- The Club received 11 applications for membership over the Christmas period.
- The Web Master advised that he has installed new web cameras which, from comments received from members are very work well. He has also installed new software and has upgraded our internet access to give us a bigger data allowance.
- Following up on the concern a member had re the possible of radio interference caused by the metal pilot barriers Peter Cossins and his team conducted extensive testing at the field. A report has been submitted to the Committee who are considering it. A copy of the report will be put on the Club web site so that members can view it. Committee member Steve Malcman liaised and assisted the team.
- The soil removed from the work of cleaning out the drains around the pits has been removed.
- The sealing of the toilet floors are on hold due to an illness in the contractor's family.
- Peter Harris and Norm Morrish will continue to clean the toilets in the short term. A new cleaner will then be sought after COVID restrictions ease.
- During the orientation of new members, where possible they will be introduced to other committee members and advised of instructors if they require them.
- Mowermen have recently done a training program conducted by Craig Fitzsimons.
- Concern was expressed at the number of Members not conforming to safety rules. Such as not standing behind the pilot barrier, remaining on the runway after takeoff, starting model unrestrained, working on electric models with the motors active. Members need to be more safety conscience.
- Work was done trying to get the old watering system operational however this has proved not possible.
- Spraying of the runways will be done soon. A sign will be erected to advise when spraying has been done.
- The new shade cloth has been installed on the South West shade structure.
- Work to prevent birds roosting in hay shed and pooing on the floor is being done.
- VMAA Has advised the VMAA Trophy is to held on May 1 & 2 at the NFG field. Club Captain is seeking members interested in being in the team.

- Approval was given to a caravan club, Western Wanderers, to camp at our field over the period Feb 25 to 28. They have been advised that they are not to use the club rooms and must conform to COVID requirements.
- Approval was given to Hobby Creations to host a Fun Fly day on Australia Day, Jan 26th and that they
 are not to use the club rooms and must conform to COVID requirements.
- The Classic Aerobatic, Fun Fly and mass glider launch was set for Feb 20th.
- The Large Scale Aerobatics Group were granted permission to hold a contest at the field on May 15 & 16th. It was noted that the field will not be closed during this event. They were informed that they should take action to ensure that all model are not noisy.
- Monty Tyrrell Scale Rally is still on the program.
- It appears that the Sandown Hobby and Model Expo has been cancelled.
- SAM600 has applied for a date to hold one of their contests. We are seeking details of how they will restrict their aircraft to our ceiling height of 1500 feet before allowing their contest to be run at the field.
- Quotes are being sort for the construction of drainage junction pits with lids. This work is being paid for from an MAAA grant. It is urgent that the work be done ASAP to conform to grant requirements.
- Quotes are being sort for new timber to rebuild and rejuvenate the entrance to the field.
- A submission for materials required to install a new upgraded runway watering system has been done.
 This will be submitted to the VMAA seeking a grant of about \$9,000 as part of the VMAA grants scheme.
- The organisers of the Berwick Show asked us if we wanted to be involved. The web manager has assisted the organisers to set up a web site for us as part of their site. We are currently working on a promotional video about the club to be uploaded to the site.
- The committee appointed Keith Quigg to be the Club Chief Flying Instructor. His duties are yet to be fully determined, but will include assisting with the training of members.
- The committee reluctantly decided not to hold a face to face General meeting due to COVID
 regulations/rule. Some of these are; the club rooms can only hold 10 persons; A meeting outside is
 subject to weather; Chairs would have to be set up suitably spaced and sanitised both before and after
 the meeting to name a few.

The next committee meeting is to be held on Thursday night February 18th 2021. The date and type of the next General meeting will determined as the COVID restrictions/requirements change.
