SECRETARY'S REPORT

Minutes of the P&DARCS General Meeting held on Wednesday 10th February 2021 via Teleconference

Meeting to opened at: 7:35pm Chair for this meeting: President, Bill Reynolds Members Present on-line: 28

Minutes of previous Meeting: Motion that the minutes held previous general meeting be accepted. Moved; Glen Cosser Seconded: Peter Harris CARRIED

Business Arising from Previous Minutes; Nil

Reports President:

He advised the meeting that Keith Quigg had been appointed to the non-executive position of Club CFI (Chief Flying Instructor) to look after pilot training within the club.

Secretary:

An application for a grant of \$9,400 has been submitted to the VMAA for the purchase of the equipment required to install a new runway watering system for the Eastern and Main runways. The installation of the system to be done by working bees if we are successful in obtaining the grant.

The VMAA has published a new policy on grants to clubs. One the conditions is that there must be at least 4 years between successful grants.

MAAA Grant. Last year the Club was successful in obtaining a grant of \$4,000 from the MAAA to overcome a safety hazard by constructing 3 drainage pits with lids to cover the open holes/pipe junctions. Trying to get quotes and the works were delayed due to the virus situation. We were able to get an extension in time from the MAAA to get the work done. However the works have become urgent so quotes are being sort for the works.

Lease; The Club has signed a \$1,000 per year lease between Darcsfield co-op and P&DARCS for our field to formalize the arrangement. It was found necessary to have a formal lease to clarify which items are covered by what insurance policy.

Treasurer:

The Treasurer updated the members of the club of the club's financial state.

Treasurer moved his report be accepted. Seconded; Allan Coleman **CARRIED**

Registrar:

Registrar unable to attend.

Secretary advised that the Membership is currently at 167 members,

Eleven membership applications have been received and the names of the applicants published in the newsletter. The committee will vote on offering the applicants Probationary Membership at their next meeting.

Peter Harris advised that 2 new applications had just been received. These will be listed in the next Newsletter for consideration.

Peter Harris advised that the committee would do some multi inductions over the weekend due to the number of new members.

Field Manager:

Absent

Peter Harris advised that 2 working bees had been done where they had removed all the low branches of the trees on both sides of the driveway plus others, allowing clear access for mowing. A big thank-you to lan Jaques for proving his "mulcher" to handle the pruning.

Facilities Manager:

The shade cloth on the south east shade hut has been fitted. Bird proofing has been done in the "hay shed" in an attempt to prevent birds from crapping on the floor.

Peter advised that the club house has been opened up but this must be done complying with the Covid requirements which were published on the club web site. It has mainly been used to get hot water and drinks. Norm and Peter Harris have taken over the task of cleaning the toilets.

Norm Morrish advised the meeting that there appeared to be some "scammers" appearing at the club offering to spread material / crushed rock at the field for free. This was a known scam and members were strongly advised not to let anyone do anything at the field, unless authorized by the Committee

It was asked if there could be more chairs for outside use. Peter Harris advised he did not have a problem with this but any chair used must be sanitized before and after use in accordance with Covid rules. Norm noted that he had not seen anyone clean a chair. He suggested that members must clean the chairs in accordance to the requirements or bring their own.

Safety Officer:

Glen reminded members to comply with the club and MAAA rules particularly with new members. He noted that some turbine pilots were not ensuring the correct clearance around the model during start up and having a fire extinguisher operator present during the start up. It was noted that there appeared to be several safety problems during the Hobby Creations day particularly among the visitors. It was suggested that a designated CD be appointed for such events.

Glen advised that he and Peter Harris would be conducting a safety audit of the facility in the near future. There was suggestion from the floor that jet start up areas be fenced. It was suggested that some safety cones be used to designate the clearance area. The problem of a permanent safety barrier is it impacts on the mowing of the field.

Peter Harris expressed concern that the rules around turbine start up etc should be part of the inspection process and reinforced by the inspector.

There is a permit log book in the club which notes the models that have been inspected. This should be completed by those with models requiring inspection/permits.

Models requiring permits must not be test flown prior to the inspection process by an MAAA Inspector. There was a suggestion from the floor to take a picture of the permit and keep it on your phone.

Editor;

Absent. Request for articles.

Norm Morrish reminded members that photos of juniors at the field should not be posted on the web or the Newsletter without the parent's permission. He noted that the picture of a new junior and his farther in the Newsletter was done with the permission of the father. **Webmaster:**

The new web cameras have been installed and operating well. He thanked Peter Harris and Peter Hill for helping him. He also advised that the new club computer has been installed and operating well.

Don Klein expressed his thanks to Daniel for all his great work with the web camera system.

Social:

Don noted that he checked out a possible visit to the Vietnam War museum at Phillip Island and also Moorabbin aircraft museum. He was having trouble contacting them but will persist.

Club Captain:

VMAA Trophy is scheduled to be held at the NFG field on May 2 & 3rd. Peter requested those interested in assisting to contact him. He also asked that members support the team by attending the event in May as supporters. Last time there a lot of the supporters and team members camped at the field and had a great time.

General Business

1. Members were reminded to ensure that new members are greeted and introduced to existing members to ensure that they feel welcome. Members were reminded that they must wear the Club badge so that we know you are a club member and we can use the name to speak to them and make them feel welcome.

2. Keith Quigg asked if there were any club polo shirts available. Daniel noted that he would look into this.

3. Steve Malcman reported that Peter Cossins had completed his radio testing and that the report was in the newsletter and on the club web site.

4. Andrew Sill queried the radio testing that was done on the Sunday of the fun fly. Bill Reynolds advised that a member had contacted that secretary asking for permission to do some radio testing on the control line circle. The Sec discussed this with Bill and they agreed that they give approval. It was noted that the application appeared to indicate that there would be only one person involved. There was no mention of reports etc. It was suggested that the committee look into this matter.

Peter Harris noted that everyone should be careful making accusations about other qualifications etc.

5. The Sec advised that he thought the Sandown Train & Model Expo has been cancelled. He also reminded members that the Monty Tyrrell Scale Rally is being planned and hopped members with attend with their scale models.

Keith Quigg advised that the Sandown Train and Model Expo had been cancelled.

6. Glen Cosser advise that Monty Tyrrell's granddaughter expressed interest in attending the day last year. He suggested that she be asked to attend the Monty event this year.

7. Norm Morish gave a brief information session on the planned Roy Rob Old Timer, Multi Launch Glider and Classic Aerobatics event on the 20th. No catering at the event.

8. Daniel reminded members that the Western Port Drifters caravan club was visiting the club on the 25th and they have been advised the Covid requirements.

9. Norm Morrish raised the issue of the noise of the Large Models.

Steve Malcman advised that he is working with the Large Scale Aerobatics member/pilots to quieten their aircraft. There was a suggestion from the floor that an i-phone has a noise meter in it ?.

Secretary's Summary of Committee Meeting

The Club's committee met for the second time in 2021 on Thursday night February 18th via Zoom. Some of the items considered are noted below;

- The changes to the COVID restrictions to be continue to be monitored to ensure the club conforms.
- Eleven Prospective members, Christopher Keller, Cooper Keller, Paul Marlan, Timothy Morland, Anthony Peate, Terence Pollock, Paul Rolph, Darren Taylor, Paul Van Tongeren, Rodney Watkins & Richard Wiggan were voted into the Club.
- The Club received 3 applications for membership in the last month.
- Following up on the concern a member had, re the possible of radio interference caused by the metal pilot barriers, Peter Cossins and his team conducted extensive testing at the field. A report has been submitted to the Committee. Committee member Steve Malcman will present the report at the March General Meeting and a vote taken at the March meeting as to accept the report or not.
- The sealing of the toilet floors is still on hold due to an illness in the contractor's family and maintenance work to be done.
- Peter Harris and Norm Morrish will continue to clean the toilets in the short term. A new cleaner will then be sought after COVID restrictions ease.
- Spraying of the runways has been done soon. Drains have also been sprayed.
- Work to prevent birds roosting in hay shed and pooing on the floor had to be interrupted due to a safety complaint.
- Due to Covid restriction the approval to the caravan club, Western Port Drifters, to camp at our field over the period Feb 25 to 28 was withdrawn.
- Due to Covid restriction the Classic Aerobatic, Fun Fly and mass glider launch set for Feb 20th was cancelled.
- Monty Tyrrell Scale Rally is still on the program, we are hoping!!!!!!!
- The Sandown Hobby and Model Expo has been cancelled.
- The SAM600 event scheduled for Feb 20 has been cancelled.
- A quote for the construction of drainage junction pits with lids funded by an MAAA Grant has been received and approved. Work hopefully to start in a couple of weeks.
- Quotes are being sort for new timber and materials to rebuild and rejuvenate the entrance to the field.
- A submission for materials required to install a new upgraded runway watering system has been done and submitted to the VMAA for their consideration.
- We advised the Berwick Show organisers that we would like to be involved. As part of this we were asked to provide a promotional video of the club for their web site. Club member Andrew Sill was ask by the committee if he could prepare the video. Andrew prepared a fabulous video about the club and is on our web site. It has been sent to the Berwick Show people.
- The club's new CFI attended his first committee meeting and is in the process of coming up to speed.
- The committee again reluctantly decided they were not able to hold a face to face General meeting due to COVID regulations/rule. This will be continually monitored.
- The Darcsfield coop has advised that they are in the process of preparing an inventory of equipment and buildings to clearly identify who owns what for the purposes of insurance.
- Due to the absence of the Safety Officer a Supplementary Committee meeting was held to consider the Safety Incident Report. The Safety officer fully investigated the matter and advised that safety was not compromised. The committee agreed with the findings of the Safety Officer and a response will be sent to the writer of the Incident Report advising him that safety was not compromised.
- Concern was expressed at the recent Fun Fly in that there appeared to be no person/CD in charge of the day. The Club has a document that should be completed by groups using the field for these type of events so that a person is responsible for the day.

The next committee meeting is to be held on Thursday night March 18th 2021. The date and type of the next General meeting will determined as the COVID restrictions/requirements change.

FIELD MANAGERS REPORT

Our field is looking at it best at the moment, runways are still green, the pit area hasn't dried out too much. We've had a nice amount of rainfall, I would like more.

Our last working bee all of the drainage soil was removed and cleared away.

Spraying of all the broadleaf weeds on the runways and some of the pit area was completed on an early Thursday morning with the help of Ian Jacques, thanks mate again.

That day we also sprayed out all of the drains, around buildings and the driveways.

After many weeks, the spraying has had a lot of effect and is progressing well, more will be needed in the very near future.

The fire breaks have been slashed around the field as this was very long and hazardous, still a lot more to be done.

Apart from that, my grounds crew are working very hard maintaining our awesome field and I thank them for all their effort and hard work.
