SECRETARY'S REPORT

General Meeting Held Saturday 4th May 2019

Business Arising: Nil

President:

- Congratulated the P&DARCS Team for winning the VMAA Trophy for the 4th time in a row.
- Informed the meeting that Rob Till had undergone surgery and was recovering well and was up and about in hospital. Scheduled to leave on Monday.
- Advised that Colin Nichols had injured his hand due to prop strike. He needed surgery. Colin was at the meeting and advised that the injury was progressing well.
- Reported & extended his congratulations to Glen Orchard & Norm Morrish who placed first & second in F3A at the MAAA Nations.
- Reported that there was a low flying full size aircraft incident on ANZAC day. A letter had been sent by the Club Secretary to the Royal Vic Aero Club.

Treasurer:

The Treasurer provided report on club finances. He reported that the Club was operating within budget and it appeared that there would be a surplus at the year's end.

Treasurer moved his report be accepted. A. Coleman Seconded B. Law. **Carried**

- 2019/20 Budget. The Treasurer presented a draft budget and spoke to the document. He highlighted that the items in the new budget reflected the current year and appeared to be reasonable and did not require modification.

The Treasurer proposed **"the tabled budget be adopted for the 2019/20 year and that the club fees remain unchanged."** This was seconded by Don White. **Carried.**

The Treasurer advised the meeting that the VMAA & MAAA had not yet set their 2019/20 fees and he noted that as soon as they did the Club Registrar would prepare to send out renewals for the 2019/20 year.

Registrar:

- Absent.
- The Treasurer reported that the club had had a good year with a good number of new members joining. He noted that some 25 members would be offered the opportunity to purchase a share in the club and become "full members". As per the Constitution their names have been published in the Club Newsletter.
- The Treasurer responding to questions from the floor gave a brief session and the options and repercussions of purchasing the share parcels in the club for those being offered the opportunity to purchase a parcel of shares.

Facilities Manager:

- Paul Somerville reported that he was constructing a 'fire cart' with the assistance of other members which was about 2/3 complete
- They are also planning to construct a garden tools cart to ensure that there is a good supply of tools when required at working bees.
- Paul advised that he was working on the table in the pit area.

Field Manager: Apology

Safety Officer:

- Reported on the finger strike injury to Colin Nichols. He reported that the prognosis for Colin's finger was good. He reminded everyone to be ever vigilant around propellers.
- He also noted the low flying incident on ANZAC day which had been covered in detail in the President's report.
- Flying etiquette; He noted that members need to be mindful of club rules particularly with respect to where you stand when flying. He noted that there were several incidents of members standing in front of the "pilot barrier" line. They must stand behind the barrier or the "barrier line". This is to ensure safety and not impede the view of other pilots. It was agreed that the Committee clarify where pilots should stand and publish results in the Newsletter.
- Discussion then followed about the perception that some aerobatic pilots seemed to demand that they fly on their own. It was noted that there is no rule that allows pilots to have clear airspace but those that wish to have clear air must fit in with others and not demand it. It was emphasised that everyone be aware and establish an etiquette that will be good for all.
- Insects on the flight line; Concern was raised about the swarming biting insects on the flight line. Daniel reported that he had sprayed the bushes but it appeared to do nothing. He further reported that he had a look at the long grass safety barrier and thought that the build up of "mulch" in the barrier may be the reason for the insects, ie a breeding medium. He proposed that the barrier and the mulch be removed which will hopefully remove the insects. It was agreed that the Committee would look into the matter.

FIELD MANAGER'S REPORT

Hi members, I am back from 2 months caravanning in Queensland and NSW, mainly competing in Aerobatics in Canberra, then the Trans Tasman and Masters in Queensland's Sunshine coast, then back to Richmond NSW and finally the National Championships in West Wyalong, NSW. Was no sooner back then went to our state championships in Bendigo mid May. I will do a separate report for next newsletter re the aircraft in the War Memorial in Canberra and the museum in Temora. A fantastic trip, and a highlight was meeting our foundation member Peter Cousins at the Nationals. It is the first Nats that he has ever attended and he did it in style, flying up with John Riley in a small aircraft. I will be heading to Italy for the World championships early August as a Team member and reserve pilot.

As stated in my last report in February, I have not used the sprinklers and I am very happy to see how flat the runways are. They do not have the raised mounds where the sprinklers are, because when used, the sprinkled water expands the peat clay while all the other areas not saturated shrink, creating uneven runways. The shrinkage for this very dry weather was at least 40mm as can be seen beside the concrete at the hay shed and the western charging area. The ground at the western charging area was levelled 2years ago.

I am not happy to see so many cracks in the East runway and thank you everyone who helped fill them in for the Monty Tyrell day. I am very happy to see how good the west runway and main runways are, they only have a few cracks, in comparison to last year, and after such a long hot summer and autumn. Last spring I used our spreader to top dress the bad areas on the far side of the main runway, the west and the east runways and these areas have very few cracks. I will now apply a larger quantity of lime with our spreader on the east runway in winter and then look forward to less cracks. The original soil expert said 3 years ago that the cracking problem will be easy to fix, it is only a matter of getting the ph levels correct and will be solved totally as the couch becomes the predominant grass. I believe we are definitely on the right course of treatment.

The new areas of soil and seed, that we did last spring have survived the hot spell, unfortunately the horrible thick Kikuyu that I killed off has started to spread again. I plan to get the grass experts in to seek their advice as to how best eliminate it from the runways.

I plan to smooth off all the cracks in the next few weeks so that they become smoother for the models and the mower men.

It is really good to see how our new driveway is smoothing out. Please keep to 30kph. I will spray weed killer on the edges to keep them as the wider drive.





