Facility Manager Report

As you will be aware by now there are major works happening at the field in front of the club house and under the hay shed as well on the perimeter of the pit area. We are paving the path in front of club house and in the hay shed. It will be a mixture of concrete and paving stones. This will make the area cleaner more visually pleasant to walk on and more useful for club functions.

Models are not to be fuel up or started inside the hay shed.

The hay shed is only to be used for charging and storing of models during bad weather.

The three pads on the outer pits area along side the runways will be start up pads for larger models as well as your normal models. It also will have restraint tubes cast into the concrete, heavy duty steel solid poles with insulated foam covers will also be provided once the pads are finished. The concrete pads will also be coated with an epoxy coating to protect the concrete from fuel spills. The pads ARE NOT TO BE USED UNTIL the epoxy coating is applied.

Overall the VMAA is looking to promote foster and administer aeromodelling within the state.

The MAAA deals with establishing competition rules and procedures for modeling activities such as rules for displays, large models, turbine models. appoint the large model and turbine inspectors following recommendations from the states. They also source our insurance coverage and deal wit the government on our behalf on issue such as frequency and CASA regulations.

The most beautiful aircraft ever made


Dassault Mirage

Australia has a remarkably good record in purchasing front line jet fighter aircraft. The selections of Vampire, Sabre, Mirage and FA-18 have all proved to be absolutely first class aircraft that have served many countries extremely well. To turn our back on the traditional suppliers, the United Kingdom and the United States to purchase the French aircraft must have been very controversial at the time but time has proven the RAAF's decision to be correct.



The Mirage was designed very early in the fifties and daringly incorporated several very new concepts some of which were influenced by German research during WW11. Even the French engine was a derivative of a BMW WW11 design! The delta wing was quite radical then but flew well on the first Mirage which was much smaller than the final design and most notably had an extraordinarily large tailfin, perhaps another German influence. Area ruling was a new concept that allowed aircraft to fly much faster by simply changing the fuselage in a quite unexpected way yet Dassault incorporated it too. It became known as the 'coke-bottle' fuselage.

Remarkably, in those very early days of jet-fighter design an aircraft in France emerged that was to go on to be one of the very best looking and best performing aircraft of its type. It served in many, many air forces around the world and indeed still does so! Fifty of ours went to Pakistan and some of them are still flying there.



I will never forget seeing, and hearing, the Mirage at early 70's RAAF airshows at Laverton. The delta shape seemed to accentuate the extraordinary speed as they scythed almost silently towards the crowd then the sound caught up and the air reverberated with the noise. Yes, they did fly towards and over the crowd then and it cost the RAAF millions in compensation when a Mirage inadvertently went supersonic over a huge greenhouse complex at a South Australian airshow!

Pilots knew it affectionately as the Miracle although 40 (*forty!*) crashed during their RAAF service, just one reason why we chose a

twin engine aircraft to replace it. Frequently referred to as 'a flying brick' with the engine out it in fact had a glide equivalent to most light aircraft. One pilot got home, just, after an extraordinarily long glide from down Torquay way.


The Mirage has that wonderful combination of form and function that qualifies it as one of the great beauties. It is a little sad to see the old engineless one at Moorabbin but a closer look will reveal the gorgeous subtleties in the curves built into the delta wing and the wonderful flow of the fuselage that let it cut through the air so easily. Simple in outline yet infinitely subtle in detail this aircraft is not only one of the most successful but also one of the most beautiful ever to take to the sky.

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
