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# Some of the ugliest aircraft ever made!

I actually have very mixed feelings about calling this aircraft ugly. It is not so much that it looked ugly as that it just looked wrong, very wrong! This, the last large bi-plane British bomber, had its engines attached to the upper wings rather than the usual practice of having them on the lower wings. Then the lower wings were located a long way below




the fuselage, definitely not the norm! The undercarriage was streamlined with huge fairings which looked very utilitarian to put it politely. They were in fact utilitarian in that they did reduce drag by a remarkable amount and enclosed the fueling and oiling points which made servicing the aircraft so much easier than others.

The location of the lower wing gave the gunners an excellent field of fire and a retractable 'dustbin' gun turret guarded against attack from below. The bombs were assembled on a rack on the ground and winched up into the mid lower wing as a unit greatly improving the rate of rearming a bomber and this could all be done quite safely with the engines running making this one of the quickest bombers to turn around between sorties. A set of dual controls could be fitted in thirty minutes, movement within the fuselage was excellent, folding seats and tables were cleverly incorporated into the design, light ladders were carried on board to access the engines, there was provision for electrically heating the crew's flying suits and many, many other features both large and small mark this as a particularly carefully designed aircraft.

The Heyford was a true 'missing link' between the bombers of the two world wars. An all-metal monocoque forward fuselage and metal framed wings were signs of things to come. Experiments were carried out with an enclosed cockpit but it was not adopted. The Heyford was very popular with its pilots and it was remarkably maneuverable. At one Hendon airshow the crowd was simply stunned to see one looped! Several squadrons operated the Heyford but it was a frontline bomber for a very few years in the Thirties. It carried a small bomb load a long way but at very low speed and all were retired by the late Thirties. One carried on for a short while as an experimental machine and became the first aircraft in the world to carry radar.

Good and practical aircraft though it was the Heyford looked obsolete from the beginning and with its extraordinary lower wing location and heavy looking wheel spats it always looked wrong, so very wrong.....almost ugly!

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
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
