DON'T TRUST YOUR LIPO BATTERIES



One of my Turnigy LiPOs decided to blow up while being charged, the charger was set at 1C, the packs were 4S 5000mA in pairs, making 8S 5000 packs

I set them going, and the current was around 3 amps, as they were nearly full, I went into the house for some late lunch, the smoke detector went off in the garage, the results can be seen below





The chargers were Redback Racing Scorpion, they program the same as Turnigy chargers, they were fed from a 40 amp power supply, the black box on the right

It seems the centre pack exploded, and blasted the center charger, the heat then set off the adjacent packs, and the left hand charger got blasted

Some people suggest the centre charger went faulty, setting off the centre LiPO??

The concrete pavers saved the lot burning through the plastic table, and igniting balsa stored under, if that happened, I would have lost my entire workshop and equipment, just as well I took the paver precautions, the pavers were very hot, the whole workshop is covered in a fine black ash, and a big stink

I now intend to charge the LiPOs in separate steel boxes, fireproof cash boxes, if a LiPO blows up in a steel box, on the pavers, I would only have smoke, and one stuffed LiPO, **as in the pic' below**, using Turnigy Accucell + Hyperion chargers, the little box top left has switches to allow me to separately select the chargers

BRIEF HISTORY Of The C.A.C, Wackett Bomber, CA15 & CA31

Commonwealth Aircraft Corporation (CAC) have, in the past, been responsible for the design of such aircraft as the Wackett Trainer, the Boomerang, the Wackett Bomber (originally called the Woomera), shown in the Pic' below



Then under license the factory manufactured the P51D Mustang fitted with the RR Merlin, followed by the F86 Sabre fitted with a "real engine" the RR Avon also manufactured at CAC.

After this a design exercise for a high speed single seat interceptor the CA31 photo shown reached the fill size mockup stage only to be scrapped through lack of RAAF interest.

The CA15, was a modified P51D. In fact, it was considerably longer, deeper with a huge underbody scoop, a much smaller canopy and had larger flying surfaces, including dihedral applied to the rear stabilizer. The original design request by either government and / or RAAF, etc, was for a competitive top line fighter aircraft near the end of WW2. The only engines that seemed to be suitable were the multi - row radials from the American Corsair, Thunderbolt, etc. The plane was then designed to fit these to the so-called modified P51D, as shown in the pic' below



However, during this design stage, the Americans, etc. decided they could not spare their multi - row radials, and so an alternative was hurriedly searched for.

A Rolls Royce Griffin was supplied on loan by the British government and a prototype CA15 built. The nose section of the original design was hurriedly modified to accept the Griffin, which was approximately twice the horse-power of the original P51's Merlin. The CA15 was finally finished too late for its original job, and the prototype No.A62 - 1001, was successfully flown and highly praised by the test pilot. Photos included were taken during engine run-ups at the Fisherman's Bend airstrip. Top speed was reported to be in excess of 450 mph.

Now, as an interest to modelers, this design whilst on the drawing board was enthusiastically followed by all the design staff. One aero modeler (Keith Shilling) in the design staff built a one-sixth scale model. As shown in the pic' below



This history has been dug out of the feeble minds of the ancient designers to the best of their knowledge, and happily dragged out of them at current luncheons.
