SR-72 darkstar top speed:

According to current information, the SR-72 Darkstar is expected to reach a top speed of Mach 6 which translates to approximately 4,000 mph (6,400 km/h), making it significantly faster than the previous record holder, the SR-71 Blackbird.

Key points about the SR-72's speed:

Mach 6: This is the widely reported top speed for the SR-72.

Hypersonic flight: The SR-72 is designed to fly at hypersonic speeds, meaning much 0 faster than the speed of sound.

Developed by Lockheed Martin: The SR-72 is being developed by Lockheed Martin's Skunk Works.





Any particular discipline?: Large Scale Aerobatics (IMAC), Glider Aerotow (Tow Pilot) and F3C (Helicopters)

Preferred type of aircraft?: Large scale Petrol, Jets, Scale model aircraft and helicopters

What do/did you do for a living?: Business Development Manager – Energy Consulting (Procurement)

When and how did you get into the hobby?: My father introduced me to control line glow powered models from a very young age – I think I was six at the time. At the age of 11, I was introduced to Remote Control Gliders (initially) and then Glow Powered fixed wing model aircraft. I progressed to remote control helicopters when I was 17 and was pretty well self-taught - learning to fly competently in a short period of time.

Do/did you fly in competitions?: I have competed in Scale competition, F3C (Helicopters) and IMAC (Large Scale Aerobatics) and have frequently entered into club team events such as the VMAA trophy (Thermal Glider and Scale events).

If so, have you won or placed in them?: I have frequently placed in top three podium positions in IMAC, F3C and also in scale 'Flying only" categories.

What other hobbies or interests have you got?: I am a member of a motor car club.

Do you have pet?: Not yet but I am wanting to adopt a Chihuahua.



## **RECIPE OF THE MONTH** Bobotie (South African Beef Casserole)

This delicious one pan dish comes from Chef John and is his take on the traditional South African Beef Casserole called Bobotie. The flavours are divine and it's slightly sweet due to the fruit chutney. The addition of bay leaves gives a lovely fragrance to the casserole. Enjoy.

Tips:

I used a chili chutney that had raisins in it as that's what I had in the fridge. You could also use Mango chutney or old-fashioned Rosella fruit chutney.

I didn't have any white bread so used a light rye which worked perfectly. The bread gives a nice texture to the meat mixture and makes it a bit creamier.

Amounts shown will feed 4-6 people with vegetables or salad on the side.



## ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon of olive oil
- 1 tablespoon of butter
- 1 large onion, diced
- 1 teaspoon of salt, plus more to taste if needed
- 5 teaspoons curry powder
- 1/2 teaspoon of ground turmeric
- 1 teaspoon of ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon of freshly ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon of dried oregano
- 500g of ground beef
- 4 bay leaves, divided
- 1 rounded tablespoon of tomato paste
- 4 cloves of garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons of lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon of lemon zest
- 1 tablespoon of apple cider vinegar, or to taste
- 1/2 teaspoon of Worcestershire sauce
- 1/3 cup of Indian-style fruit chutney, or to taste
- 3 slices of white bread, crusts removed
- 1 1/2 cups of milk, divided

2 large eggs

1 pinch of cayenne pepper, optional

Method:

Preheat the oven to 175 C

Heat olive oil and butter in a large oven-proof skillet over medium heat

Add onions and salt, and cook until just beginning to soften and turn translucent, 3 to 5 minutes

Stir in curry powder, cumin, turmeric, black pepper, and oregano, and cook for 1 to 2 minutes more

Add ground beef, and cook, stirring, while breaking the meat up into small crumbles.

Add 1 bay leaf, tomato paste, and garlic, and cook, stirring, for another 2 minutes

Stir in lemon juice and zest, vinegar, Worcestershire, and chutney. Smooth the top, and simmer mixture gently for 5 minutes

Meanwhile, add bread to a bowl and cover with 1/2 cup of milk, toss, and let stand for 5 minutes

Squeeze excess milk back into the bowl and add soaked bread to meat

Mash, smash, and stir mixture until bread is thoroughly blended into the meat mixture

Add remaining 1 cup milk to the bowl; add eggs, cayenne, and pinch of salt, and whisk thoroughly

Pour gently over meat, and top with 3 or more bay leaves

Bake in the preheated oven until custard on top is set and lightly golden brown, about 45 minutes

Let rest 5 minutes before serving
