Hi Everyone,


Welcome to another edition of the newsletter.



Our gallant Musketeer found himself on the ground and in a level of agony rarely experienced by his brethren.



RECIPE OF THE MONTH Pork Chipolatas with Onion Gravy

This is truly comfort food at its best. Only takes around 20minutes to make and is delicious with mashed potato or cheesy buttery noodles. Enjoy.

I buy pork chipolata sausages in a pack of sixteen. I always have a pack in the freezer for emergencies. They are a cheap and cheerful meal.

Feel free to use any favourite sausages. Chipolatas are available in chicken or beef as well.

Amount shown will feed 4-6 people.



Ingredients

2 teaspoons of olive oil 2 brown onions, halved, thinly sliced 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar 1 tablespoon of beef stock powder 1 tablespoon of plain flour 16 lean pork chipolatas Salt and pepper to taste Sprig of fresh sage 2 cups of water (more or less)

Method

Preheat the oven to 180c fan force Place the sausages in a roasting tray and spray lightly with oil Roast for 20 minutes until nice and coloured Set aside until needed Heat oil in a large frying pan over moderately low heat Add onion; cook and stir for 8 minutes or until soft Add in the beef stock powder and flour and cook for a minute Add in balsamic vinegar and 1 cup of water Simmer for a few minutes until thickened Add in additional cup of water as needed until your gravy has the consistency you like

Add in the sausages and gently combine them with the gravy

Simmer for a few more minutes until the sausages are cooked through

Finely slice the sage leaves and add to the gravy keeping some aside to garnish the top

Taste for seasoning

Serve piping hot on creamy mashed potatoes or cheesy, buttery noodles
