Insurance David Walsh

There has been some concern aired amongst club members that we may not have adequate insurance cover at the club. I believe that these concerns are as a result of not fully understanding the make-up of the current MAAA insurance package. So I will briefly detail below what the MAAA has in place. Of course you should also always consider your own circumstances and make sure that you have personal insurances to protect your income etc should you ever be injured either at the club or elsewhere.

Being in the insurance game in my day job I need to give you this warning first :

Any general advice in this article does not take account of your personal objectives, financial situation and needs. If you wish to revise your own personal insurance protection you should obtain your own independent professional advice.

If you go to the MAAA website <u>www.maaa.asn.au</u> and click on insurance information then MAAA insurance summary you will find an excellent brochure produced by the MAAAs broker summarising the covers. So I will just give general information here. I will also print one of these brochures off and stick it up in the club house.

Currently the MAAA have insurance covers for Personal Accident insurance, Public Liability Insurance and Professional Indemnity Insurance.

Personal Accident

This covers members between the ages of 2 and 90 whilst involved in sanctioned activities as per the MAAA MOP (Manual of Procedures) ie whist flying at the club, other clubs and in competition as long as you are abiding by MAAA rules. The cover under a personal accident policy is for loss of weekly income (80% of net weekly income up to \$1,000 per week for up to 104 weeks) it also has some student assistance cover.

It also covers Non Medicare medical costs up to \$4000 per injury and there is cover for death or permanent disablement where a lump sum settlement may be paid according to a scale of benefits which establishes an arbitrary amount for loss of use of various body parts. There are other conditions so check out the MAAA website.

If you want more cover than this you can take out you own personal accident or disability covers if you really want to make sure you are protected I would suggest you see a financial Planner to discuss these covers.

Remember you are only covered by Workcover if you are an employee and the injury occurs in the workplace in working hours. Self-employed people and also employees who want cover outside of working hours need to organise their own covers

Public Liability

This policy provides indemnity for insured persons/entities that are held liable for a negligent act whilst involved in sanctioned activities as per the MAAA Manual of Procedures, and result in property damage or bodily injury anywhere in the world excluding USA and Canada.

The above is the quote from the MAAA brochure. The thing to remember is that the policy also has member to member cover so whilst this statement refers to protecting the member who caused the injury against legal action against him it is also the spot you can go if you yourself are injured seriously in an incident at the field. The catch is that you may have to take legal action against the party that caused your injury.

Now I have heard members say that you should get personal cover for this and yes you could try and in fact some home and contents policies (if you have contents cover) would also cover you if you were the party causing the injury. BUT they would also usually need to be triggered by some legal document stating that you were being held liable for the injury you caused.

Professional Indemnity;

This is provided for Committee member's officials, inspectors or instructors for an error in their advice that results in and injury or property damage to a third party.

Field Managers Report. By Norm Morrish August 2011

It has been very disappointing to see the runways in such a bad state. The mower men had the field looking so good late last year and legend couch was starting to develop nicely on the main strip. Keeping the blades sharp on the new mowers is so easy and this avoids blunt blades pulling the grass out by the roots. Leaving the cut grass on the field was also giving nutrition to the grass.

Early August we were lucky with the weather and Ted Stevens was able to roll the runways and then we cut them with the large front deck mower. They looked great again, but only for a few days when the heavens opened again. Today, 16th August, the runways are saturated, with puddles everywhere and rough flying surface again. It needs regular rolling and Ted has offered to do this when dry enough !!!

Drainage work update. We have fixed the bog hole in the middle of the main car park by installing new drains and a pit beside the shed. We have lowered all pipes under our drives to improve drainage. A spoon drain now runs on the northern end of the west strip, up to the dam fence. It also runs along the dam fence to the base of the high ground and it also runs on the western side of the west strip. This now reduces the amount of water running from the west paddocks onto our west strip. A spoon drain was also made to drain the southern side of our main strip. It runs to the eastern fence, then along the fence to our large spoon drain that runs at the northern end of our east strip.

These two new drains have certainly improved the drying out for mowing, especially the southern side of the main strip. This had been a constant lake all year and difficult to retrieve a plane if you landed on the other side of it. I will now look at improving the eastern runway and pits. The place looks a mess at the moment but all piles of dirt will be used to fill up low areas when it dries out, unfortunately It is not suitable for the runways.

Sincere thanks to Peter Harrison for towing the excavator to the field and all the days that he came down to help. Thank you also to Shaun Burke, Ian Jaques, Frank McPherson, Ernie Hancock, Norm Parker, Paul Somerville, Ivan Chislett, Doug Dorrat, Graeme Pentland, Colin Nichols, Alan Foley, Bill Hawkes, Laurie Anderson, Ted Stevens and Bruce Horskins for their terrific help with the drainage, especially during the bad weather.

Work done at the over the last few weeks includes :

- * Towbar fitted to the front deck mower
- * Irrigation pump re-fitted for use in summer if that happens

This Tuesday 23rd,

- * Collect and mulch dries tree branches
- * Spread mulch under pits flight benches & fill boggy entry to main strip
- * Conduct a test rolling of the main strip but too soft to continue
- * Cut the main and west strips with front deck mower, looking good
- * Create a new spoon drain to drain " lake " on pits west side

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CIVILIAN CLASSICS

Learjet

Bill Lear is said to have used the wing and undercarriage of a Swiss jet fighter, the FFAP-16 as the basis of his gorgeous business aircraft which first flew in 1963. Certainly the Learjet as he named it, with the ultra thin wing and tip tanks, looked as sleek as any fast jet in the military at the time. It must have been a huge risk for his financial backers as nothing quite like this had been put on the market before. At that time most companies wanting their own air transport still used various propeller driven aircraft. One hundred and five of the first model, the Learjet 23, were sold in just two years and a whole new field of commercial aviation was in business.



In 1966 a new model was introduced with tip tanks, greater pressurization, more powerful engines and a new windshield. This model was followed by a huge variety of models with ever increasing size, speed, range and luxurious interiors. Other manufacturers followed suit and Cessna in particular gained a large share of the market with the Cessna Citation range. Our Dick Smith owns a Citation for personal use and has generously begun hosting a regular radio control aircraft event on his private airfield in NSW.

The company has passed through several hands and Learjets are now made in Canada by Bombardier Aerospace. Modern business jets come in many sizes but most still have the basic configuration of twin rear mounted engines with swept wings becoming more common.



The racy looking wing tip tanks have been replaced by winglets to reduce drag. Some have intercontinental range and can cruise at 900 kilometers per hour at over 50,000 feet! The passengers are cosseted in a luxurious cabin with all modern conveniences and important business matters can continue to be dealt with in flight.

A huge number of business jets are now owned world wide by both companies and wealthy individuals. Many air forces use them in various roles also. The RAAF uses Bombardier Challenger jets for VIP travel. A Learjet actually held the Los Angeles to Washington record at one time and was only beaten by an SR-71 Blackbird. What a classic!
