Field Manager & Safety Officer's Report

Hi guys, we were very lucky this month.

The recent Gippsland floods only caused minor flooding at our field.

The runways and pits were under water for two days and it only reached our footpath at front of clubhouse. It did enter our shed and toilet block so nothing to clean up because the water flow was slow moving and clean.

We closed the field for three days to protect the runways and car parks.

The machinery was moved to the high ground by Paul Somerville and myself. We drove through 200mm deep water to get them there. We used the Kubota tractor to ferry us back to get the next machine. We certainly got wet as we walked back after the final transfer. A set of size 10 gumboots are now located in our poisons locker for future escapades.

We will soon begin to construct a high ground on the northern side of our large tanks.

When I arrived at the field at 3pm, Fowler Rd was dry on left hand side, up to our entry gate, but flooded after our entry drive. It was too deep to drive my car to Fowler Rd Bridge so I used the tractor. The flood water was entering our property from the western drain near the Fowler Rd bridge. It was also flooding the Farm to our north. I also drove to Ballarto Rd bridge and the western drain was not at our field height and water was flowing freely to Western Port Bay.

The runways were too soft, 10 days after the floods, to use the front deck mower so I used the John Deere ride on mower to mow the drier parts of the main and eastern runways.

The drainage work we did last year certainly helped the water drain away. We were planning to start the other drainage work immediately after the long weekend but this is now delayed for a few weeks. We have dug a sump pit at the rear of the clubhouse and this will eliminate the stagnant water ponds under the clubhouse. Good flying guys.

The other drainage work involving a contractor using a large excavator is due to start on Wednesday 20th, (ED)


MILITARY CLASSICS

De Havilland Mosquito

This aircraft is surely one of the most successful and best looking aircraft of all time. De Havilland proposed the aircraft as an unarmed bomber utilizing a wooden structure using the methods it had used to build the Comet racer and DH 91 Albatross airliner. The new aircraft would rely on its sheer speed to evade enemy fighters. Official reaction was lukewarm at best and initial prototypes had turrets and even a tail gunner was considered.

With the outbreak of war interest in this aircraft became more urgent and the production of a limited number with two 1,750hp Rolls Royce Merlin engines was approved. The first flights were made in late 1940. Only very minor problems were encountered and buffeting was subsequently cured by extending the rear of each of the engine nacelles. Mass production followed.



Performance exceeded the most optimistic predictions and general handling was excellent. At 361 knots (415 mph, 668 km/h) it was much faster than any of the allied or axis fighters of the day! A 4000 lb bomb load was extraordinary and four 20 mm cannon in the nose and four .303 machine guns in the wings made it a potent ground and sea attack aircraft and an air to air fighter which would claim many successes during the war.

De Havilland Mosquito

The Mosquito, known as the Mossie to all those who flew it, eventually fulfilled a vast number of different roles. They were even fitted with bouncing bombs of dam-buster fame but for use against shipping. A 57 mm anti-tank cannon was fitted to some and rockets to others. Some flew completely unarmed as target tugs or as high speed photo-reconnaissance aircraft.



Almost 8000 were made including 212 made here in Australia.

They served with many country's air forces and Mosquito missions were flown as late as 1955 with the RAF in Malaya. Tragically, the last flying Mosquito crashed at an English air show in 1996.


Several projects are under way though and there are high hopes that we will see one fly again in both New Zealand and Canada before the end of this year.

I would go a long way to see this great Military Classic in the air again!



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
