## **RECIPE OF THE MONTH**

## Cevapi

Cevapi (pronounced *CHAE-vap* or *CHAE-vap-ee*) are hand-shaped, case-less sausages that are popular in Croatia, Serbia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, and other countries in the Balkans/South-eastern Europe region. They are so easy to make and are delicious with Macedonian Avjar, coleslaw and buttered rye bread. Enjoy.

Tips:

Feel free to make these less spicy by omitting the cayenne and chili flakes.

Do include the baking soda as this being a raising agent, it makes the texture of the sausages very light and bouncy.

We enjoyed ours with Avjar. Avjar is made with roasted peppers, eggplant and garlic and is the pride of Macedonian cuisine. The recipe is one of the biggest secrets of the Balkan kitchen. It's traditionally prepared at home, in yards and gardens. Jars are readily available in good European delicatessens.

Amounts shown made around thirty Cevapi. They freeze very well



### **Ingredients:**

500g minced pork

500g minced beef

500g minced lamb

1 egg, whisked

4 cloves of garlic, minced

2 teaspoons of ground black pepper

1 teaspoon of salt

1 teaspoon of baking soda

1 teaspoon of cayenne pepper

1 teaspoon of chili flakes (optional)

½ teaspoon of paprika

### Method:

Combine the ground pork, ground beef, ground lamb, and egg in a large bowl

Add garlic, black pepper, salt, baking soda, cayenne pepper, chili flakes and paprika

Mix well using your hands; form into finger-length sausages about 3/4-inch thick

Cook sausages on a preheated grill or skillet, turning occasionally, until no longer pink in the centre – about 15 minutes. A meat thermometer inserted into the centre should read 70 degrees

Serve piping hot with your favourite condiments
