### **IMPORTANT NOTICES**

#### **OUR RUNWAYS**

The condition of our runways has steadily deteriorated over the last few years, due to dry weather, poor soil PH, salt content, and infestation of a destructive grass root eating African Black beetle, this beetle has also created large crop losses at local market garden sites

Norm Morrish our Field Manager, is currently consulting with an Agronomist and a seed provider in our local area, to formulate a plan to correct the deterioration of our runways See Norm's reports in this Newsletter and also the February Newsletter for all the details

#### HOW DOES THIS EFFECT YOUR FLYING?

Before you start a take-off run, have a look at the particular runway you are using and plan where you wish to take off & land, thus avoiding cracks.

#### **VISIT BY PAKENHAM CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL**


<u>Treasurer.</u> A comprehensive report on the clubs finances presented to members present. Moved P Harris that the report be accepted. Seconded F Connelly Carried

#### FIELD MANAGER

Again, Please read this. It contains more important info about our Runways.

I met with the local Soil expert, an Agronomist from Browns Fertilizer in



Koo Wee Rup. The good news is she states our soil, Peat Clay, is very easy to treat to stop cracking and agrees with me that a fine couch grass is required. She took soil samples and felt Lime will be required because our land was a sea bed and will be salty.

She also said Gypsum makes the soil worse and this is what was used many years ago because in those days Gypsum was used to break up Clay.

We found a few beetles and she has identified them as the African beetle that is becoming a real problem to the vegetable growers. They kill off the grass in December January, just when it heats up, leaving no cover for our soil. This is why our runways are the worst I have seen for a few years.

The soil tests revealed Lime is required and not expensive to do. At present I am finalizing costs to do the Lime in 2 stages. First the West side, including the West section of the main runway, the pits and carpark. When the lime has settled in to the soil we will then do the East side. The timing will be finalised to suit the type of Couch and rainfall. I am meeting with both the Soil and the Seed specialists to determine suitable timing. When the couch grows we will no longer need to fill in cracks. When this happens you guys will owe me a few beers !!!!! Daniel Jenkins and I have nearly finished the levelling of the North end spoon drain on the East runway. Have bought 22 cubic metres of screened soil to finish it plus to fill in runway cracks. I will need a hand to do this so if you see me out on the runways please come over and do the soft shoe shuffle to help fill the cracks. I will not be able to do it all on my own. At present you will damage your undercarriage
