PRESIDENT

The weather has not been kind over the last few weeks so many of us have not been flying, hopefully this will change very soon.

Many of you would be aware of the **Avlite strobe installation** issue to prevent low flying aircraft.

This has been ongoing for a year now with a lot of work done by the Committee.

Despite the fact that we have support from flying schools and CASA we have been advised that we were not successful in obtaining a grant from MAAA.

This is very disappointing as I would have thought that such a safety issue as this would be of prime concern to the MAAA.

Despite this, the club has purchased the Avlite and it will be installed very soon.

Paul Somerville has taken on the task of fabricating the appropriate steelworks and installation.

A number of members have asked the Co-Op why we had to fund the re-location of the windmill, a new bore and associated works. The Co-Op leases the land to a tenant farmer who relies on sufficient water to feed his stock and manage the land.

We are fortunate to have a good tenant who takes responsibility to maintain fences, slash the paddocks, bale hay and take care of the property in general. In addition of course he pays leasing fees to the Co-Op.

The bore is owned by the Co-Op and is not the responsibility of the tenant under lease. Without water we would have no tenant and I doubt if the mower men would look forward to mowing and slashing 100 acres.

I look forward to improved weather as we're heading towards summer and get back to what we all enjoy doing.

Safety

Reported that there was an incident at the field where a member had his fingers attacked by a propeller. It appears that the model was restrained securely on the table but the actual model restraint, that wasn't being used was moving towards the propeller with the vibration and without thinking the member grabbed it to stop it. In the process he put his hand through the propeller arc. A freak accident but a good lesson to learn NEVER become complacent when starting your model. Use full concentration at all times and if something out of the ordinary happens your first reaction should be to stop the motor. Then attend to the stray object. Easy to say in hindsight but let this sink in the old brain for when it happens to you.

Field

- Norm has sharpened the mower blades
- Norm and Daniel will be Spraying for Beetles and cope weed later this month. Probably fertilise in October.

Facilities

- Will mount the Strobe light later this month.
- Will look at erecting the fuel shed once the instructions are digested. Need to plan move of fuel tanks and will then erect shed around them.

General Business

 Point made that there are proposals for a major airport with CASA around the Koo Wee Rup area. Probably won't impact on our use if it is built apart from possibly restricting our height to 400 feet. Point was made that it may also stop light aircraft flying so low over our field. Could be quite a few years away but worth keep our eye on.

Barry Law gave Co-op report on bore and windmill situation and there was general discussion of why we need water to the property. Reason being to keep a tenant farmer on the property as his stock need water. The bigger picture would be If we had no tenant we would have 100 acres to maintain and slash

- So, while cost has been high to restore water in the short term the long-term cost would be much higher without water.
- Fred Webb, suggested that we approach hobby suppliers such as Model flight to sponsor our windsock or an event day now Model Engines had closed. It was pointed out that the committee had thought about this but hadn't seriously discussed until things settle down with the Exit of Model Engines from the industry. Committee will put more consideration into this in the future
- Peter Harris mentioned Frank Mac efforts to create a tough possibly expendable model for the VMAA Trophy event. Frank had the Core Flute model at the meeting.



New Weather Gauges to Display Data

Over the last month I have put in place some new software to display the data from the P&DARCS Weather Station. The two main reasons I chose to do this are:



- 1. To make the data easier to read. The new view is a lot cleaner, it does not have any of the graphs. These new gauges also look a lot better on mobile devices, especially phones.
- 2. The new gauges are near real time. They pull data every 15 seconds from the server, whereas the old view only updated every 5 minutes

If I'm honest I've always found the weather station view a bit chaotic. With dials and graphs a lot of information is available, but for most people it's irrelevant. These new gauges view just displays the basic stats.

For the time being both versions are available on the website. Please have a look under Our Field → Club Weather

As mentioned above, this data is near real time, the green light at the top right indicates data is live. If the data stops for 20 minutes or more, this would go red. So, whilst this does not show any timestamp like the old view, if it's green, it's working

Whilst viewing the gauges, you can also click on a specific gauge to get some more statistics above that item. If the Wind Rose gauge confuses you (it did me) Google it to get an understanding of how it works. So, go have a look at the new gauges and let me know what you think!!



Viewing the club website on a mobile

Obviously, It's possible to view the club website & the above gauges on a mobile phone. One question I get asked a lot is how to navigate when viewing via a mobile. If you look at the screen capture you'll see three horizontal lines. If you click that, you can then navigate the menu as you would on a PC. I've also modified the P&DARCS logo to make it look nicer on a mobile device as previously it did not resize properly to fit.

BUILDING A "SMOOTHIE 40" MODEL

When I heard Balsa USA had released three nostalgia kits one of them caught my eye. It was the Smoothie 40. They have the larger version, the Smoothie XL but the 40 was the one for me. I have been dabbling with a couple of older designs, mainly C/L, and converting them to R/C which can be a challenge sometimes. The Smoothie 40 was designed back in 1973 and except for one change it is how it was manufactured back then, all balsa and ply and not one piece of fiberglass or ABS. If you want a cowl then made it from balsa blocks.

Building is straightforward and I converted it to electric. The only factory change was to have two servos for the ailerons instead of one in the center of the wing. I do tend to over build sometimes so I added some sheer webbing and a fiberglass "bandage" to the center section of the wing. I was surprised not to see that on the plan or in the instructions. Maybe they didn't do that back then. Anyway I ended up with a nice strong wing. I also lowered the cockpit canopy to give it a more racy look.


The undercarriage is pre-bent wire and all you have to do is bind it with copper wire and solder it together. It is also mounted forward of the leading edge so ground handling and nosing over shouldn't be a problem. The chrome wheel hubs and spinner also set it off.

The wing and tail feathers are covered in Solartex but I glassed the fuselage because I wanted to paint it. I used auto paint in a spray can for the fuz and the same colour trim for the Solartex. The trim came out great with a nice sharp line from the masking tape which is not bad considering the Solartex is textured. The Smoothie came in just under the maximum weight which somewhat surprised me because of the fiberglass and paint.

Anyway it was good to get back to the old ways of building with eyes and nostrils full of balsa dust. Some things never change

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
