FIELD MANAGER'S REPORT

Hi members, well I am back from the Aerobatic world Championships, held in the beautiful area of Lake Garda, Northern italy. It was a fantastic 3 week trip and returned home mid August.

My apologies for no reports over the past few months and also for not posting the aeroplane pics from the War Memorial and Temora. I will try to get them in the next newsletter.

I have been busy at the field during the past month and I am very happy to say that in my opinion the runways are the best they have ever been. The areas that we levelled a year ago and sowed with new couch grass are now thriving and are still level, even after the recent minor flood. It will take another year for this fine tough Sahara Couch to show us how our future runways will look. Ian Jaques who is our longest serving mower man said the other day that he really likes the new couch and how good the runways are starting to look.

Yes we did have cracking in the East runway and the southern edge of the main runway in March this year, but they were much less than what we had the previous years. I have used our spreader to apply more lime pallets to these areas in June and they have well and truly soaked into the soil so it will be interesting to see the results next March.

The other very satisfying fact is to see the main runway now settled to a much more level runway without humps around the sprinkled areas, The sprinkler heads are now level with the runways again instead of being 50mm lower, damaging undercarriages. This is due to not using the sprinklers. Again this summer I do not intend to use the sprinklers. The main pits and the west runway are not sprinkled and they are not cracking because we have the lime level correct. You will certainly remember they used to have bad cracks and was a risk to twisting ankles.

The runways were rolled for at least 8 hours, 3 weeks ago and we will be rolling them again at end of September when they dry out a bit but are still soft. The runways, carparks and pits have been sprayed to kill off the broad leaf weeds and the drive and the area around the tanks behind clubhouse were sprayed with round up weed killer. We are battling with some heavy rain but we are getting on top of it, so a very special thank you to our mowing team for keeping our field looking great.

We have also removed the dense shrubs from around the mustang so that the direction of the mustang can be easily seen, however the main reason to remove them was they were a haven for the midges in March and April, plus they were perfect for snakes to hide under. 8 Years ago we removed a shrub beside the ladies toilet entry because of a snake hiding under it.

Always feel free to discuss with me any concerns you may have with the field.


