
Clubhouse Doors Refurbishment



Presidents Report April/May 2023

Members have no doubt noticed the lack of newsletter for March. Put simply, lots of us on the committee had a pretty busy month with several issues forcing the newsletter to take a back seat. The work that Frank and others put into the monthly newsletter publication is not insignificant, so at times the deadlines will win. At our next general meeting at the club, we will be discussing the commencement of bi-monthly general meetings and a similar timetable for newsletters.

Over the weekend of April 1st and 2nd, we held the highly anticipated Monty Tyrrell Scale event. As members would be aware, we scheduled the event over two days and it was a great success. These events are made possible thanks to the support of our valued sponsors, Model Flight in Adelaide, Austars Models Sydney, XC RC in Blackburn, the MAAA, and the VMAA. I would also like to acknowledge the support and effort that the ASA (formerly VicScale) put in to getting the event running along with their sponsors Scale Aeroproducts and Holk RC.

The Monty Tyrrell Scale Event has been an annual event that celebrates the art of scale modelling, and it provides a platform for model aircraft enthusiasts to showcase their skills with other like-minded individuals. Saturday was by no means perfect with a cool breeze and some showers late in the day, but Sunday was perfect conditions. This year's event attracted around 47 registered pilots and some 65 model aircraft crowding our pits area. A few of those models were on static display, but most were airborne during the weekend. Frank has included a series of photographs from the weekend further into the newsletter.

Our next general meeting (1pm, Saturday May 6th) at the field will cover our fee structure for the 2023/2024 year, so I encourage as many members as possible to attend this meeting. March 15th 2023 Committee Meeting Summary

The Club's committee met on Wednesday night March 15th via Zoom.

Some of the items considered are noted below;

- There were no Prospective Members to be voted on this month.
- There were two Prospective Member applications received, John Scott and Alex Williams .
- Melissa Law was voted to be offered Full Membership.
- Consideration of what to do with repairing the club house floor. It was considered that the floor has dried out sufficiently to allow further work to be done. Currently still investigating how to get the floor sanded in preparation of installing floor covering.
- The Club received a bill of \$50-00 from Stephen Green for copyright payments in that the Club Editor inadvertently used an old cartoon in the Club Newsletter without his permission. The committee were very disappointed at the action taken by the member of our club but paid the account to minimize the fuss.
- An "Events Registration System" has been installed on our web site for the Monty and has been working well. Members are encouraged to use this system.
- Work to start soon on fixing in place the benches in the West charging station.
- Quotes will be obtained on the installation of better gates into the adjacent properties to enable access of our "fire wagon".
- Mark Smith requested to provide the Committee with advice of what is proposed for the CL Circle.
- Committee thanked David Law for his speedy action in repairing the damage caused by the recent break in.
- Due to the recent break in in which some of the club's special keys issued to members were stolen, we have had to completely overhaul our locking system. To issue new "special" keys and locks would have been a very large expense. The committee have decided to go with "numeric coded" locks. The members will be advised of the 2 codes to open the gate and club room. A system will be set up where members can get the code should they forget it. The instructions and details will be circulated to members prior to introduction which is planned to be just after the Monty.
- Field Manager will have topsoil delivered to do general runway maintenance leading up to the Monty. He asked for members to volunteer for working bees to be held shortly. Weed spraying has also been recently done.
- It was agreed that when the Eastern Pilot barrier is moved, a better location could be identified. A suggested location will be pegged out to enable members to comment on the proposed location. This to be done after the Monty.

- Several serious safety issues were identified regarding a turbine aircraft. The committee agreed that the Safety Officer issue the member a “Club Safety Violation Notice” due to; over-flying the mower crew, not complying with Turbine starting rules, and flying practices.

Our field is in excellent condition for this time of year, apart from the usual cracking. It's not as bad as other years in the past. Slight cracking on the main, only on edges, nothing down the middle at this stage.

The Eastern runway has a bit more but mainly on edges, the Western has a lot of cracking all over as this took the brunt of the flooding and took ages to dry out.

Be Cautious when flying on the West.

A lot of Spraying has taken place on our new carparks, drains, around buildings and field. Also please remember our Mowing crews have priority when we mow the runways.

Absolutely No flying on the runway that is getting mowed at the time.

We don't want to cease all flying while the field is getting mowed if incidents keep happening. So please be patient while mowing takes place.

Our mowing crews work very hard to keep our field looking immaculate.

WORKING BEE Saturday 25TH March 2023

A special thanks to the twenty five members who assisted with the working-bee held on Saturday 25TH March. Without your help we would not been able to do the project.

We started work at 8am and by 11am had used all to the 7 meters of soil that was delivered. We managed to repair the cracks on most of the East and Main Strips.

In order to maximise the effectiveness of the days program, we split into 3 team. The first team loaded the soil into the trailers and deliver it to the runways. Two other teams repaired the cracks on the runways.

PROCEDURE

Locate cracks and use shovels to cut a wedge in the soil.

Push/Pack the wedge over the crack to prevent the top soil from falling a metre down the crack.

Fill with top soil provided and rake smooth.

I am happy to report that the project has been very successful and the vast majority of the cracks are still sealed four weeks after the repair. Also thanks to Craig, these runways have now been rolled after the 38mm of rainfall and are significantly improved.

We still have the West Runway, the ends of the other two runways and some of the Pit area that are in need of repair.

ROY ROB Memorial Trophy February 26th 2023

Competitors arrived for The Roy Robertson Event facing strong wind conditions but it was decided by the flyers to press ahead with the competition consisting with 3 rounds 2 to count and see what happens.

Texaco was the first event of the day with 7 entries consisting of a mixture of models not all bombers, a pleasant change, the wind caused some dramas on takeoff and landing with Pat Keeley almost losing it on takeoff and Steve Gullock's model having to have a prop change as it didn't move forward at all into the head wind but it worked well as he came home 1st in this event and Don Grant lost his model downwind on the other side of a canal. The model was later located by Peter Timms using his drone and has been recovered with minimal damage to the covering. I think most competitors were glad when this event was over as it was very nerve raking. Ian Robinson had an altercation with his prop and came off second best. He was rather more concerned with loosing working time which cost him the round.

After lunch was the fast-climbing Duration event, again I/C only, the wind didn't create as many problems as the previous comp as they have much better penetrating power, the only casualty being Steve Gullock with his Dooling 29 playing up. There were 4 competitors in the flyoff with the event being dominated by the 2 wind loving Cumulus's with Lyn Clifford 1st and Kevin Fryer 17 seconds behind him coming 2nd with our visitor from N S W Peter Van De Waterbeemd flying his Bomber coming in 3rd.

Not realizing the unofficial 1300 Texaco event had not been run in conjunction with the other events I asked the competitors to clear the runway after the Duration event was completed, as there were a number of members waiting to use the main strip.
